By Mr. Flaherty of Boston, petition of the Massachusetts State Law Enforcement Committee and Michael F. Flaherty relative to maintaining a minimum of seventy per cent of police personnel on duty in cities and towns and in certain law enforcement agencies of the Commonwealth. Public Safety.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO MAINTAINING AN ADEQUATE POLICE FORCE ON DUTY AT ALL TIMES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any other provision of the General Laws,
2 the chief of any city or town police department, the com-
3 missioner or superintendent of the police force of the metro-
4 politan district commission, and the commissioner or chief law
5 enforcement officer of the uniformed branch of the division of
6 state police in the department of public safety, are hereby
7 directed to maintain a minimum of seventy percent in per-
8 sonnel, for each tour of duty, based on the number of men
9 who would ordinarily be scheduled to report for each partic-
10 ular tour of duty.
