AN ACT RELATIVE TO SICK LEAVE PAYMENT TO STATE EMPLOYEES  
UPON DEATH OR SEPARATION.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Notwithstanding any provision of law, rule or regulation to
- 2 the contrary, any employee of the commonwealth who is
- 3 separated from the service of the commonwealth by reason of
- 4 death, retirement or resignation shall be paid an amount equal
- 5 to the total sum of his unused accumulated sick leave credits.
