AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE FREE USE OF SCHOOL PROPERTY BY  
NON-PROFIT, RELIGIOUS AND VETERANS' ORGANIZATIONS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as  
follows:*

1 Section 71 of chapter 71 of the General Laws, as most re-  
2 cently amended by chapter 344 of the acts of 1966, is hereby  
3 further amended by inserting after the fourth sentence the follow-  
4 ing sentence: — No school committee shall make any charge for  
5 the use of such property by any non-profit, religious or veterans'  
6 organization, provided that the total expenses for the free use of  
7 such property shall not exceed seventy-five hundred dollars in  
8 any school year, which sum shall be included in the school de-  
9 partment budget for such purpose.
