**AN ACT FURTHER PROVIDING FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A DAVID I. WALSH-LEVERETT SALTONSTALL VISITING LECTURESHIP AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MASSACHUSETTS.**

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. To provide for a David I. Walsh-Leverett  
2 Saltonstall visiting lectureship program in practical politics and  
3 public affairs at the University of Massachusetts, the university  
4 may annually expend therefor such sums, not to exceed  
5 twenty-five thousand dollars, as may be appropriated.

6 The president of the university and the board of trustees  
7 shall select as such visiting lecturers individuals who are both  
8 learned and experienced in practical politics and public affairs,  
9 and who possess the ability to communicate such knowledge to  
10 university students.

11 The duties of the visiting lecturer shall be decided upon by  
12 the president of the university and the chairmen of the depart-  
13 ments of government.

14 The visiting lecturers shall be appointed for a period not to  
15 exceed one year, and they may be assigned to the university  
16 branch at Boston or Amherst for a full year, or may be  
17 assigned to either branch for one semester or less.

1 SECTION 2. Chapter 607 of the acts of 1967 is hereby  
2 repealed.
