AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE REGISTRAR OF MOTOR VEHICLES TO ISSUE DISTINCTIVE PLATES TO CERTAIN TOTALLY DISABLED PERSONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The sixth paragraph of section 12 of chapter 90 of the
2 General Laws, as most recently amended by chapter 742 of the
3 acts of 1969, is hereby further amended by striking out the
4 third sentence and inserting in place thereof the following
5 sentence: — The registrar may also furnish plates of a distinc-
6 tive type or types for a pleasure passenger vehicle owned and
7 used by a blind person, a person who has suffered the loss or
8 permanent loss of use of one or both feet, or one or both
9 hands, or who is totally disabled according to the provisions of
10 the federal social security act, or according to federal social
11 security records receives total disability payments, and the
12 registrar may determine such standards of disability and of
13 qualification for the issuance of said plates as he deems proper.
