

# HOUSE . . . . . No. 2329

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By Mr. Danovitch of Norwood, petition of the Massachusetts Public Employees Council 41, AFSCME, AFL-CIO, for legislation to provide differential pay for certain state employees required to work evening and night tours of duty. Public Service.

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## **The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Two.

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AN ACT PROVIDING DIFFERENTIAL PAY FOR CERTAIN STATE EMPLOYEES REQUIRED TO WORK EVENING AND NIGHT TOURS OF DUTY.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Notwithstanding any law or rule to the contrary, any person  
2 employed by the commonwealth who is assigned a tour of  
3 duty which is called the evening tour of duty shall receive in  
4 addition to the rate in the group of the general salary schedule  
5 to which the class is allocated, a differential of fifteen dollars  
6 per week while so assigned. Any person employed by the  
7 commonwealth who is assigned a tour of duty which is called  
8 the night tour of duty shall receive, in addition to the rate in  
9 the group of the general salary schedule in which the class is  
10 allocated, a differential of fifteen dollars per week while so  
11 assigned. Payment under this section shall be made in accordance  
12 with the pertinent rule or rules of the director of  
13 personnel and standardization.
