AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE PAYMENT OF LONGEVITY TO CERTAIN EMPLOYEES OF THE COMMONWEALTH.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Any full-time regular employee of the Commonwealth shall
2 receive, in addition to his regular base salary, an additional five
3 percent of his base salary for service on his Twenty-Fifth Year,
4 an additional five percent on his Thirtieth Year, and additional
5 five percent on his Thirty-Fifth Year, an additional five percent
6 on his Fortieth Year, and an additional five percent on his
7 Forty-Fifth Year, all accumulative.
