

HOUSE No. 2536

By Mr. Flaherty of Boston, petition of Michael F. Flaherty and another relative to the protection from fire afforded by the walls, partitions, ceilings and corridors in certain buildings. Public Safety.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Two.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE PROTECTION FROM FIRE AFFORDED BY THE WALLS, PARTITIONS, CEILINGS AND CORRIDORS IN CERTAIN BUILDINGS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 15 of chapter 143 of the General Laws, as amended,
2 is hereby further amended by inserting after the third sentence,
3 as appearing in chapter 539 of the acts of 1949, the following
4 sentence: — Such building shall not be so erected or altered
5 unless the walls, partitions, ceilings and corridors thereof are to
6 be constructed of such material and in such manner as to be
7 rated, when tested by a method recognized by such supervisor
8 of plans as standard, to be able to resist fire for at least one
9 hour, nor unless, when tested in accordance with National Fire
10 Protection Association bulletin No. 255 of May eighteenth,
11 nineteen hundred and sixty-one, the flame-spread classification,
12 the fuel contribution classification, and the smoke development
13 classification of the exterior surface of such walls, partitions,
14 ceilings and corridors are each between zero and twenty-five.

- 2 It hereby further amended by inserting after the third sentence
- 3 as appearing in chapter 239 of the acts of 1909, the following:
- 4 "Section 1049. - Such holding shall not be so treated as stated
- 5 unless the walls, partitions, ceilings and windows thereof are so
- 6 so constructed of such material and in such manner as to be
- 7 tested, when tested by a method recognized by such agencies
- 8 of plans or standards, to be able to resist for a least one
- 9 hour, not more, when tested in accordance with Section 1049
- 10 Fireproof Association Bulletin No. 122 of May, 1916.
- 11 members listed and sixty-one, the names of such members
- 12 the full construction classification, and the names of such members
- 13 classification of the exterior surface of such walls, partitions,
