The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Two.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT CERTAIN VETERANS, UPON BECOMING MEMBERS OF CERTAIN CONTRIBUTORY RETIREMENT SYSTEMS, SHALL HAVE PRIOR SERVICE IN ARMED FORCES CREDITED AS CREDITABLE SERVICE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Paragraph (h) of subdivision 1 of section 4 of chapter 32 of
2 the General Laws is hereby amended by adding at the end the
3 following subparagraph: —

4 If a veteran as defined in section one becomes a member of
5 a system as so defined subsequent to his last discharge or
6 release from wartime service, he shall have credited to him as
7 creditable service his active service in the armed forces as if
8 during the period or periods of such active service he had been
9 on leave of absence from the governmental unit to which such
10 system pertains.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE FEDERAL FOOD, DRUG, AND COSMETIC ACT
AND TO CERTAIN OTHER FEDERAL LAWS RELATIVE TO THE
REGULATION OF DRUGS AND COSMETICS.
SECTION 1. The Commission of Massachusetts shall have the honor
to advise the Secretary of Health and Human Services, United States
Department of Health, Education and Welfare, of the results of its
investigation into the safety and efficacy of the drugs and
cosmetics which are the subject of the Federal Food, Drug, and
Cosmetic Act, and to report thereon to the Governor of the Commonwealth
not later than the first day of January, 1972.

SECTION 2. The Commission of Massachusetts shall have the honor
to advise the Secretary of Health and Human Services, United States
Department of Health, Education and Welfare, of the results of its
investigation into the safety and efficacy of the drugs and
cosmetics which are the subject of the Federal Food, Drug, and
Cosmetic Act, and to report thereon to the Governor of the Commonwealth
not later than the first day of January, 1972.

SECTION 3. Paragraph (a) of subsection 1 of section 1 of chapter 124B
of the General Laws is hereby amended to read as follows:
"1. The Commission of Massachusetts shall have the honor to advise
the Secretary of Health and Human Services, United States Department
of Health, Education and Welfare, of the results of its investigation
into the safety and efficacy of the drugs and cosmetics which are
the subject of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act, and to report
thereon to the Governor of the Commonwealth not later than the first
day of January, 1972."

SECTION 4. If a certain or certain other Federal law, in effect on
the date of the enactment of this Act, is found to be in conflict with
the provisions of this Act, the provisions of this Act shall prevail
over the provisions of such other Federal law.

SECTION 5. During the period of the operation of this Act, the
Secretary of Health and Human Services, United States Department
of Health, Education and Welfare, shall have the honor to advise
the Commission of Massachusetts of the results of its investigation
into the safety and efficacy of the drugs and cosmetics which are
the subject of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act, and to report
thereon to the Governor of the Commonwealth not later than the first
day of January, 1972.

SECTION 6. The Commission of Massachusetts shall have the honor
to advise the Secretary of Health and Human Services, United States
Department of Health, Education and Welfare, of the results of its
