### AN ACT PROVIDING FOR JURISDICTIONAL MOBILITY OF POLICE.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 41 of the General Laws is hereby amended by  
2 inserting after section 99K the following section: —

3 *Section 99L.* Notwithstanding any other requirements estab-  
4 lished by law, regulation, or ordinance, any police officer who  
5 has been a member of the regular police department of any  
6 state or local jurisdiction may apply to become a member of  
7 any police department in the Commonwealth. Such police  
8 officer thereupon shall be eligible to be accepted at the same  
9 level or grade he attained in the police department of prior  
10 service, or at any other level which shall be established by  
11 appropriate Regulation as equivalent. The Division of Civil  
12 Service, with the approval of the Massachusetts Police Training  
13 Council and the Secretary of Public Safety shall promulgate  
14 appropriate regulations for the implementation of this section.
