AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE SPECIAL ASSISTANT DISTRICT ATTORNEYS FOR THE NORFOLK DISTRICT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 20B of chapter 12 of the General Laws, inserted by
2 chapter 583 of the acts of 1969, is hereby amended by striking
3 out, in line 2, the word "three" and inserting in place thereof
4 the following words: — six — and striking out, in line 5, the
5 word "six" and inserting in place thereof, the following
6 word: — nine.
