AN ACT PROVIDING THAT THE BUDGET ESTIMATE OF A SCHOOL COMMITTEE MAY BE REDUCED IN A CITY BY A FOUR-FIFTHS VOTE OF THE CITY COUNCIL AND IN A TOWN BY A FOUR-FIFTHS VOTE OF A TOWN MEETING.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 34 of chapter 71 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by adding the following paragraph: —

3 Notwithstanding the provisions of this section, a city by a
4 four-fifths vote of its city council or town by a four-fifths vote
5 of its annual town meeting may reduce the budget estimate of
6 its school committee to the amount appropriated in the pre-
7 vious year.
