AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE PAYMENT BY THE COMMONWEALTH OF CERTAIN COSTS OF THE MASSACHUSETTS BAY TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 161A of the General Laws is hereby amended by
2 inserting therein the following section: —

3 *Section 12A.* Notwithstanding the provisions of any special
4 or general law to the contrary, the fixed charges, including, but
5 not limited to, the interest on the funded debt, and principle
6 payments of the Metropolitan Transit Authority and the Massa-
7 chusetts Bay Transportation Authority, one half of the net cost
8 of express service and one half of the net cost of local service
9 shall be paid by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

Chapter 1214 of the Revised Laws of the State of New York, as amended, is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section:

Section 1214. Notwithstanding the provisions of any special law passed by the Legislature, the body herein mentioned shall be subject to the control of the State Board of Regents in the same manner as the State Board of Regents in the discharge of their duties and shall be subject to the same rules and regulations as shall be prescribed by the State Board of Regents.
