AN ACT PROVIDING CLASSES OF INSTRUCTION FOR CHILDREN WITH IMPAIRED HEARING TO PREPARE SAID CHILDREN FOR ENTRY TO INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 10 of chapter 15 of the General Laws, as appearing
- 2 in section 2 of chapter 572 of the acts of 1965, is hereby
- 3 amended by inserting at the end the following paragraph: —
- 4 The board shall establish and maintain classes of instruction
- 5 for children with impaired hearing in order to prepare said
- 6 children for entry to institutions of higher education.
