## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Two.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTIVE OFFICE FOR ADMINISTRATION AND FINANCE TO MAKE FURTHER GRANTS TO THE MASSACHUSETTS BAY TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING FOR THE CONTINUATION OF COMMUTER RAILROAD SERVICE TO AND FROM THE CITY OF BOSTON UNTIL JULY THIRTY-FIRST, NINETEEN HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-THREE AND FOR CERTAIN OTHER PURPOSES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 1 of chapter 728 of the acts of 1968,  
2 as most recently amended by section 1 of chapter 593 of the  
3 acts of 1971, is hereby further amended by adding the follow-  
4 ing paragraph: —

5 The executive office for administration and finance may also  
6 make grants to said authority of not more than seven million  
7 two hundred thousand dollars for not more than ninety per-  
8 cent of the cost to said authority of service provided from  
9 August first, nineteen hundred and seventy-two to July thirty-  
10 first, nineteen hundred and seventy-three, both inclusive, under  
11 such agreements. Except as otherwise provided in this para-  
12 graph, grants under this paragraph shall be subject to the  
13 provisions applicable to grants under the first paragraph of this  
14 section.

1 SECTION 2. Section 2 of said chapter 728 is hereby  
 2 amended by striking out the last paragraph, as most recently  
 3 amended by section 2 of said chapter 593, and inserting in  
 4 place thereof the following paragraph: —

5 The provisions of this section shall be applicable only to  
 6 service provided prior to August first, nineteen hundred and  
 7 seventy-three.
