RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION RELATIVE TO INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT IN THE COMMONWEALTH.

1 *Resolved*, That a special commission, to consist of three
2 members of the senate, five members of the house of represen-
3 tatives, the commissioner of commerce and development or his
4 designee, the secretary of human affairs or his designee, and six
5 persons to be appointed by the governor, three of whom are
6 employers of more than fifty employees, and three of whom
7 represent labor, is hereby established for the purpose of making
8 an investigation and study relative to industrial development in
9 the commonwealth, with particular reference to proposals for
10 new methods of attracting new jobs and industries to locate in
11 the commonwealth, recognizing the problems of the loss of
12 over one hundred thousand manufacturing jobs over the last
13 two years.
