By Mr. Walsh of Boston, petition of Joseph B. Walsh for legislation relative to the responsibility for certain parking violations. Public Safety.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE RESPONSIBILITY FOR CERTAIN PARKING VIOLATIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 20A of chapter 90 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by adding at the end of the third paragraph the
3 following sentence: —

4 If the registered owner of a motor vehicle involved in a
5 parking violation covered by this section is a person or entity
6 engaged in the taxicab business or the business of leasing motor
7 vehicles under the so called "drive-it-yourself" system, or any
8 similar system, wherein the amount of the rental or fare is
9 determinable in whole or in part by the distance such motor
10 vehicle travels, herein called the lessor or the employer, and
11 such motor vehicle is under lease or being operated for hire at
12 the time of such violation, such lessor or employer shall not be
13 liable under this section for any such parking violation if such
14 lessor or employer shall within seven days of the receipt by
15 such lessor or employer of notice of such violation, by sum-
16 mons or otherwise, furnish to the registrar in writing the name
17 and address of the lessee or operator of such motor vehicle at
18 the time of such violation as shown on the records of such
19 lessor or employer maintained pursuant to section 32D of this
20 chapter. The provision of this paragraph shall apply to sec-
21 tion 20C of this chapter where same is applicable.
