By Mr. Doyle of Boston, petition of Charles Robert Doyle for legislation to eliminate federal social security payments in determining the eligibility of elderly persons for exemption from real estate taxes. Taxation.

AN ACT ELIMINATING FEDERAL SOCIAL SECURITY PAYMENTS IN DETERMINING THE ELIGIBILITY OF ELDERLY PERSONS FOR EXEMPTION FROM REAL ESTATE TAXES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Clause Forty-one of section 5 of chapter 59 of the General
2 Laws, as most recently amended by section 1 of chapter 456
3 of the acts of 1970, is hereby further amended by adding the
4 following sentence: — In computing the gross receipts of an
5 applicant for exemption under this clause, any payments re-
6 ceived by him under the federal social security law shall not be
7 considered as part thereof.

HOUSE No. 2837
