AN ACT PROVIDING CERTAIN BLOOD DONORS WITH AN INCOME TAX EXEMPTION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Subsection (a) of section 5B of chapter 62 of the General
2 Laws, as appearing in section 5 of chapter 555 of the acts of
3 1971, is hereby amended by adding after paragraph (7) the
4 following paragraph: —

5 (8) An exemption of fifty dollars for each pint of blood
6 donated free to any accredited hospital or blood collecting
7 agency, provided that the total exemption for this purpose
8 shall not exceed two hundred fifty dollars in any taxable year.
