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## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Two.

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AN ACT RELATIVE TO SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION GRANTS FOR CITIES, TOWNS AND REGIONAL SCHOOL DISTRICTS WHICH ADOPT A TWELVE MONTH SCHOOL YEAR.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Notwithstanding any provisions of chapter six hundred and  
2 forty-five of the acts of nineteen hundred and forty-eight to  
3 the contrary, any city, town or regional school district which  
4 adopts a twelve month school year, shall receive a construction  
5 grant of ten per cent of the final approved cost of any school  
6 constructed by said city, town or regional school district on or  
7 after the effective date of this act, which construction grant  
8 shall be in addition to the percentage to which it shall be  
9 entitled under the provisions of said chapter six hundred and  
10 forty-five.
