

# HOUSE . . . . . No. 3732

## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Two.

AN ACT REQUIRING THE BIRTH RECORD OF A PERSON WHOSE NAME HAS BEEN LEGALLY CHANGED TO CONTAIN BOTH HIS FORMER AND CHANGED NAME.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 210 of the General Laws is hereby  
2 amended by adding the following section: —

3 *Section 15.* Upon the entry of a decree for a change of  
4 name, the register of probate shall make a return of such  
5 change to the city or town clerk who has custody of the birth  
6 record of the person whose name was changed.

1 SECTION 2. Section 13 of chapter 46 of the General Laws,  
2 as most recently amended by chapter 310 of the acts of 1966,  
3 is hereby further amended by inserting after the sixth para-  
4 graph the following paragraph: —

5 Upon receipt of a return of a change of name from a register  
6 of probate, the clerk shall amend the birth record of the  
7 person whose name has been changed so that such record shall  
8 contain both the name as previously appearing therein and the  
9 name as legally changed.
