RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION OF THE PROCEDURES AND METHODS EMPLOYED BY THE COMMISSIONER OF PUBLIC SAFETY IN MAKING ASSIGNMENTS OF STATE POLICE DETECTIVES AND TROOPERS TO THE OFFICES OF THE DISTRICT ATTORNEYS.

1 *Resolved*, That a special commission, to consist of three  
2 members of the senate, five members of the house of represen-  
3 tatives, the commissioner of public safety or his designee, and  
4 five persons to be appointed by the governor, one of whom  
5 shall be a district attorney, is hereby established for the  
6 purpose of making an investigation and study of the procedures  
7 and methods employed by the commissioner of public safety in  
8 making assignments of state police detectives and troopers to  
9 the offices of the district attorneys.
