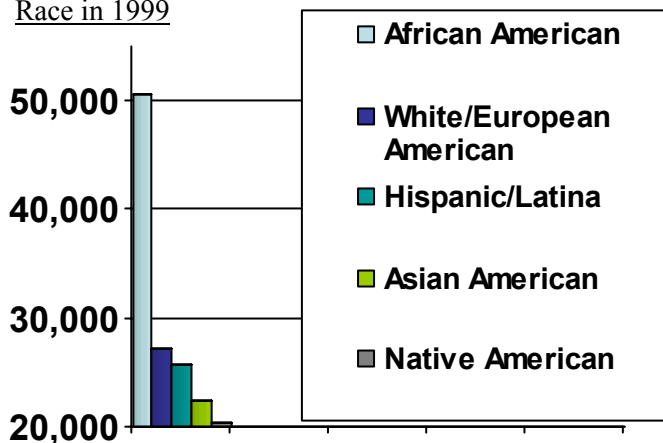

Health and Wellness

Reproductive Health

- In 2004, 149 new mothers (7.30%) in Franklin County were adolescents of age 20 or younger.
- That same year 118 pregnant women (17.80%) did not receive any prenatal care in their first trimester.
- 30.90% of new mothers in Franklin County utilized publicly funded prenatal care in 2004—a total of 203 women.
- Franklin County was the only county where there were no infant deaths in 2002.

HIV and AIDS

- In April of 2000, 16 women were living with HIV or AIDS and 4 women were living with AIDS in Franklin County.

Smoking

- 15.00% of women in Franklin County are regular smokers and 27.10% of women reported to be former smokers.
- Between 2001 and 2003, 64 women died from either bronchus or lung cancer.
