RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION RELATIVE TO THE OPERATION OF NURSING HOMES IN THE COMMONWEALTH, THEIR SUPERVISION AND INSPECTION BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND SUCH OTHER MATTERS RELATIVE THERETO.

1 *Resolved*, That a special commission, to consist of two
2 members of the senate, five members of the house of represen-
3 tatives and four persons to be appointed by the governor, is
4 hereby established for the purpose of making an investigation
5 and study relative to the operation of nursing homes in the
6 commonwealth, their supervision and inspection by the depart-
7 ment of public health and such other matters relative thereto
8 which the commission deems relevant and proper.

The Constitution of the State of New York

Article I. Section 1. The Legislative Power of this State shall be vested in a Senate and Assembly, which shall be styled the Legislature of the State of New York.

Section 2. The Senate shall be composed of twenty-four Members, who shall be elected by the qualified Electors of the State, and shall hold their Office for two Years, and until their Successors be chosen.
