

By Mr. Marshall of Quincy, petition of Clifford H. Marshall relative to the powers and duties of the Commissioner and associate commissioners of the Metropolitan District Commission. Urban Affairs.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Two.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE COMMISSIONER AND ASSOCIATE COMMISSIONERS OF THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 28 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by striking out section 3, as most recently amended
3 by section 1 of chapter 562 of the acts of 1961, and inserting
4 in place thereof the following section: —

5 *Section 3.* The commissioner shall devote his whole time
6 during business hours to the work of the commission and shall
7 be the executive and administrative head of the commission.
8 He shall organize the commission into such divisions as he may
9 from time to time determine. He may appoint a director of
10 each division to have charge of its work. Every such director
11 shall be subject to chapter thirty-one.

1 SECTION 2. Said chapter 28 is hereby further amended by
2 striking out section 4, as most recently amended by section 2
3 of said chapter 562, and inserting in place thereof the follow-
4 ing section: —

5 *Section 4.* The commissioner may appoint a secretary, en-
6 gineering chiefs, engineers, inspectors, officers and members of
7 the police force including women as special police officers and

8 school crossing guards, clerks and such other officers and em-
9 ployees as the work of the commission may require, and may
10 assign them to divisions, transfer and remove them. The secre-
11 tary shall be exempt from chapter thirty-one.
