AN ACT PROVIDING CERTAIN PUPIL PERSONNEL SERVICES TO PUPILS ATTENDING PRIVATE SCHOOLS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 71 of the General Laws is hereby amended by
- 2 inserting after section 47A the following section: —
- 3 *Section 47B.* Pupils who in the fulfillment of the compul-
- 4 sory attendance laws attend a private school within the com-
- 5 monwealth shall be entitled to the same rights and privileges as
- 6 to pupil personnel services as the school committee provides
- 7 for pupils attending the public schools. Without limiting the
- 8 generality of the words “pupil personnel services”, they shall
- 9 include psychiatric, speech therapy, remedial reading, and ad-
- 10 justment counselling services.
