AN ACT FURTHER EXTENDING THE TIME FOR THE ISSUANCE TO RESIDENTS OF THE COMMONWEALTH WHILE IN THE ACTIVE MILITARY OR NAVAL SERVICE OF THE UNITED STATES OF SPECIAL CERTIFICATES WITHOUT FEE ENTITLING THEM TO HUNT AND FISH.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:
