By Mr. Sacco of Medford, petition of George L. Sacco, Jr., for legislation to exempt certain retail establishments from the provisions of the meals tax. Taxation.

AN ACT TO EXEMPT CERTAIN TAXPAYERS FROM THE TAX IMPOSED
ON CERTAIN MEALS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 2A of chapter 64B is hereby amended by adding the
2 following clause: —

3 (b) Meals prepared and served in any retail establishment in
4 which there are no provisions for the consumption of food or
5 beverages, which are purchased therein, by the public while
6 seated.

The House of Representatives of the United States of America, in Session assembled, do hereby pass the following resolution:

SECTION 1.

That the sum of \$100,000,000 be and it is hereby appropriated for the purpose of

to be paid out of the Treasury of the United States, in such manner as the Secretary of the Treasury may deem proper.
