### AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF CERTAIN SEWING MATERIALS ON SUNDAY.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 6 of chapter 136 of the General Laws, as most  
2 recently amended by chapter 309 of the acts of 1970, is  
3 hereby further amended by inserting after clause (46) the  
4 following clause: —

5 (47) The sale, at retail, of sewing materials, including cloth,  
6 plastics, trimmings, notions, patterns and other related mater-  
7 ials therein, but not including sewing machines, between the  
8 hours of half past one o'clock and have past five o'clock in the  
9 afternoon.
