AN ACT ESTABLISHING A MINIMUM SALARY FOR CITY CLERKS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 108 of chapter 41 of the General Laws, as most
2 recently amended by section 1 of chapter 540 of the acts of
3 1947, is hereby further amended by inserting at the end of the
4 section the following: —

5 The annual salary of the clerk of any city in the common-
6 wealth shall not be less than an amount in accordance with the
7 following table. The population figure used shall be in accor-
8 dance with the latest federal or state decennial census.

POPULATION	SALARY
10,000—20,000\$10,000.00
20,000—30,000 12,000.00
30,000—40,000 14,000.00
40,000 or more 16,000.00
