The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Two.

1 *Ordered*, That the Speaker of the House of Representatives is
2 hereby authorized to appoint a special committee of five
3 members of the House to conduct an investigation of highway
4 maintenance procedures of the metropolitan district commission
5 with particular reference to repairs being made in congested areas
6 during the height of traffic flow and any matters relative thereto
7 which said committee deems reasonable and proper. Said
8 committee shall be provided with quarters in the state house or
9 elsewhere, may hold hearings, shall have the power to summon
10 witnesses and to require the production of books, records and
11 papers as it deems necessary.

12 Said committee shall report to the House of Representatives
13 the results of its investigation, and its recommendations, if any,
14 by filing the same with the Clerk of the House of Representatives
15 on or before the first Wednesday of May, nineteen hundred and
16 seventy-two.
