10 mittee shall report to the house of representatives the results of
11 its investigation and study, together with drafts of legislation
12 necessary to carry its recommendations into effect, by filing the
13 same with the clerk of the house of representatives from time to
14 time but shall file its final report on or before December first,
15 nineteen hundred and seventy-two.
