AN ACT REMOVING THE OFFICE OF ASSESSOR IN THE CITY OF MEDFORD FROM THE CIVIL SERVICE LAW.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The office of assessor of the city of Medford  
2 currently under the provisions of chapter thirty-one of the  
3 General Laws, shall, upon the effective date of this act, not be  
4 subject to said provisions of chapter thirty-one and the office of  
5 said assessor on the effective date of this act shall be deemed to  
6 have been vacated and the city manager shall thereafter appoint a  
7 qualified person to fill said vacancy.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall effect upon its passage.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE OFFICE OF ASSISTANT IN THE CITY OF  
LOWELL FROM THE CIVIL SERVICE LAW.

Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as  
follows:

SECTION 1. The office of assistant in the city of Lowell  
shall be filled by the provisions of chapter thirty-one of the  
Civil Service Law, and the effective date of this act shall not be  
subject to the provisions of chapter thirty-one and the office of  
assistant in the city of Lowell shall be deemed to have been  
created and the city manager and the city council shall  
be deemed to have been created on the first day of January, one  
thousand nine hundred and twenty-two.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
