AN ACT REQUIRING ANY PERSON FURNISHING BAIL FOR HIRE OR REWARD TO BE APPROVED AND REGISTERED AS A PROFESSIONAL BONDSMAN BY THE SUPERIOR COURT OR A JUSTICE THEREOF.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 61B of chapter 276 of the General Laws, as appearing
2 in the Tercentenary Edition, is hereby amended by striking out
3 the sixth sentence and inserting in place thereof the following
4 sentence: — The provisions of this section shall not apply to
5 probation officers.
