

## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, April 18, 1972.

The committee on Ways and Means, to whom was recommitted the Bill providing that charges between administrative agencies shall be determined at basic audit costs (House, No. 5130); and to whom were referred the Bill increasing the stipend paid to the corpsmen of the Commonwealth Service Corps (Senate, No. 141); the Bill directing the Director of the Division of Fisheries and Game to acquire certain land in the town of Falmouth for wildlife management purposes (Senate, No. 558); the Bill increasing the maximum award payable to victims of violent crimes as compensation therefor (Senate, No. 1127); the Bill making permanent certain positions in the Department of Public Welfare (Senate, No. 1186); the Bill defining the term "Fair Cash Value of Land" relative to valuation of certain state and county lands (House, No. 227); the Bill requiring the licensing of private academic schools, except those which have been in operation for five or more years prior to the effective date of this act (House, No. 290); the Bill relative to the improvement of Wollaston Beach (House, No. 480); the Bill providing for the periodic inspection of fuel injection systems of diesel engines used in motor vehicles (House, No. 586); the Bill authorizing the Group Insurance Commission to purchase dental and other health insurance for active and retired employees of the Commonwealth and their dependents and for elderly governmental retirees and their dependents (House, No. 755); the Bill providing for the retirement of certain teachers and administrators in state colleges and universities (House, No. 816); the Bill providing for the conveyance of certain land to the town of Weymouth if acquired by the Commonwealth from the United States of America (House, No. 1125); the Bill creating the position of director of campaign and political finance (House, No. 1317); the Bill increasing group life insurance benefits to retired employees of certain political subdivisions (House, No. 1338); the Bill authorizing and directing the Department of Public Works to repair or replace certain grade separation structures in the town of Mansfield (House, No. 1451); the Bill providing for the establishment of an office of federal and general solicitation at Boston State

College (House, No. 1522); the Bill to provide financial and technical assistance to low income home owners (House, No. 1844); the Bill providing school aid to certain cities and towns in which the public population has been affected by the closing, phasing out, or curtailment of services of a private school (House, No. 1884); the Bill authorizing the trustees of the University of Massachusetts to establish salaries of certain officers and members of the professional staff of the university (House, No. 1887); the Bill relative to the change in the procedure for establishing a program of financial aid for Vietnam Veterans attending state institutions of higher education (House, No. 2261); the Bill indemnifying the board of trustees and professional staff of state colleges from damage claims and providing for the defense thereof by the Attorney General (House, No. 2263); the Bill permitting the establishment of advisory committees for district planning commissions (House, No. 2624); the Bill relative to the rebate of registration fees (House, No. 2868); the Bill controlling the disposition of certain railroad rights-of-way (House, No. 3085); the Bill providing for the conveyance of certain land to the town of Hingham if acquired by the Commonwealth from the United States of America (House, No. 3157); the Bill providing for the assumption by the Commonwealth of the costs and expenses of operation of the county jails (House, No. 3500); the Bill authorizing and directing the Department of Mental Health to furnish a fire truck to the town of Tewksbury to protect the Tewksbury State Hospital (House, No. 3628); and the Bill authorizing the Department of Public Health to provide health services for the mentally retarded in schools and other facilities of the Department of Mental Health (House, No. 5334), report recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 5517) ought to be adopted.
