In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Two.

AN ACT PROVIDING TENURE OF OFFICE UNTIL AGE SIXTY-FIVE FOR CERTAIN MEMBERS OF THE POLICE FORCE OF THE TOWN OF SHIRLEY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The tenure of office of any permanent member
2 now or in the future of the police force of the town of Shirley
3 who has, or shall have, served as a member of said police force
4 for three consecutive years shall be unlimited until he attains age
5 sixty-five and he shall hold office during good behavior unless he
6 is incapacitated by physical or mental disability from performing
7 his duties or is removed for cause by the selectmen in the manner
8 provided by section forty-three of chapter thirty-one of the
9 General Laws.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
