The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Two.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR CERTAIN SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION GRANTS AND OTHER BENEFITS FOR THE GATEWAY REGIONAL SCHOOL DISTRICT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any contrary provision of law,
2 the Gateway regional school district shall be eligible for sixty-five
3 per cent of the approved cost of school construction and any
4 other benefits authorized by chapter six hundred and forty-five
5 of the acts of nineteen hundred and forty-eight, as amended by
6 chapter one thousand and ten of the acts of nineteen hundred
7 and seventy-one.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect as of January first,
2 nineteen hundred and seventy-one.

Approved for the House on March 10, 1910
and passed for a bill with amendments in the Senate

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE

Article I. The Legislative Power shall be vested in the Senate and the House of Representatives. The Senate shall be composed of members chosen by the electors in each county for a term of four years, one-third of the number to be chosen every second year, and one-third in each year thereafter. The House of Representatives shall be composed of members chosen by the electors in each county for a term of two years, one-third of the number to be chosen every second year, and one-third in each year thereafter.

Article II. The Executive Power shall be vested in the Governor. He shall hold office for a term of four years, and shall be eligible for re-election once. He shall have the honor and respect due his office, and shall be impeachable and removable from office by the Senate.

Article III. The Judicial Power shall be vested in the Supreme Court and in the County Courts. The Supreme Court shall be composed of five Justices, one of whom shall be Chief Justice. The County Courts shall be composed of one or more Justices in each county. The Justices of the Supreme Court and County Courts shall hold office for a term of six years, and shall be eligible for re-election once.

Article IV. The Electors shall be qualified to vote in the election of members of the Legislature, and shall be qualified to hold office as Justices of the Supreme Court and County Courts.
