AN ACT EXEMPTING THE OFFICE OF SUPERINTENDENT OF THE HIGHWAYS AND SUPERINTENDENT OF FORESTRY OF THE TOWN OF ANDOVER FROM THE PROVISIONS OF THE CIVIL SERVICE LAW.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The offices of the superintendent of highways
2 and the superintendent of forestry of the town of Andover shall,
3 on the effective date of this act and thereafter, be exempt from
4 the provisions of the Civil Service law.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon the completion
2 of service of each of the incumbents of the offices of superinten-
3 dent of highways and the superintendent of forestry of said
4 town.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall be submitted for acceptance to
2 the voters of the town of Andover at the biennial state election
3 to be held in the year 1972 in the form of the following question
4 which shall be placed on the official ballot to be used at said
5 election: — “Shall an act passed by the General Court in the year
6 1972 entitled ‘An Act exempting the office of superintendent of
7 the highways and superintendent of forestry of the town of
8 Andover from the provisions of the Civil Service law’ be
9 accepted?” If a majority of the votes in answer to said question is
10 in the affirmative this act shall take full effect, subject to the
11 provisions of section two of this act, but not otherwise.
