In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-Five.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE USE OF ARMORIES AND OTHER MILITARY FACILITIES FOR NON-MILITARY PURPOSES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 33 of the General Laws, as amended, is hereby further
2 amended by striking out Section 122 and inserting in place thereof
3 the following new section: —

4 *Section 122.* (a) The use of armories and other military facilities
5 may be permitted for any reasonable and legitimate civilian activi-
6 ties so long as such activities do not interfere with their use for
7 military purposes and under such restrictions and for such com-
8 pensation, if any, as may be prescribed by rules and regula-
9 tions promulgated by the adjutant general with the approval of
10 the commander-in-chief.

11 (b) The non-military user shall provide and file with the adjutant
12 general a bond in such form and amount and containing such
13 conditions as said rules and regulations may prescribe.

14 (c) All fees paid for the non-military rental or use of said facili-
15 ties may be expended without further appropriation, subject to the
16 approval of the state quartermaster and the state comptroller,
17 for the care, maintenance and the implementation of energy
18 conservation measures with regard to said facilities.
