

Accompanying the sixth recommendation of the Criminal Justice Training Council (House, No. 63). Health Care.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-Five.

AN ACT TO INCLUDE THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE TRAINING COUNCIL ON THE EMERGENCY MEDICAL CARE ADVISORY BOARD.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 7 of Chapter 111C of the General Laws is amended by
2 adding in the first sentence of Section 7 the words, the executive
3 director of the criminal justice training council or his designee so
4 that the section reads:

5 *Section 7.* Emergency Medical Care Advisory Board; Estab-
6 lishment; Membership; etc.

7 There shall be within the department an emergency medical care
8 advisory board, consisting of the commissioner or his designee, as
9 chairman, the registrar of motor vehicles, or his designee, the
10 commissioner of public safety, or his designee, the commissioner
11 of the metropolitan district commission or his designee, the execu-
12 tive director of the criminal justice training council or his designee,
13 the chief executive officer, or his designee, or each regional com-
14 prehensive health planning agency designated pursuant to the
15 federal Public Health Service Act (P.L. 89-749), and twenty-one
16 members appointed by the commissioner as follows: three from
17 the Massachusetts Medical Society; one each from the Massachu-
18 setts Nurses Association; the Massachusetts Hospital Association,
19 the Massachusetts Ambulance Association, the Massachusetts
20 Heart Association, the American Red Cross, the Massachusetts
21 League of Cities and Towns, the Massachusetts Chiefs of Police
22 Association, and the Massachusetts Fire Chiefs Association; one

23 from the volunteer ambulance associations; three at large from
 24 organizations involved in the planning for, provision of or training
 25 for emergency medical care, including any of the organizations
 26 listed above; a representative of the Governor's Highway Safety
 27 Bureau; one person who shall be an expert in communications;
 28 one person who shall be an attorney; and three who shall be
 29 consumers. Additional members may be appointed to the board
 30 by the commissioner upon recommendation of a majority of the
 31 board.
