The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-Five.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE EDUCATION OF POLICE OFFICERS AND FIRE FIGHTERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 20 of Chapter 73 of the General Laws, as most recently
2 amended by Chapter 550 of the Acts of 1972, is hereby amended by
3 striking out in its entirety Section 20 and by inserting in place
4 thereof the following new Section 20: —

5 *Section 20.* A state university, four-year college or community
6 college shall admit as a candidate for a degree any person who is a
7 member of the police department or fire department of a city or
8 town of the commonwealth within commuting distance of the
9 college, who is recommended by his superior officers and dem-
10 onstrates sufficient capacity to complete the program that he is
11 enrolled in. A police officer or firefighter who is so admitted shall,
12 while enrolled as a student in good standing at such college, have
13 his tuition paid by the commonwealth.
