## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT CLASSIFICATION OF RISKS AND PREMIUM CHARGES FOR MOTOR VEHICLE LIABILITY INSURANCE BE UNIFORM THROUGHOUT THE COMMONWEALTH.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 All automobile insurance rates shall be based on a flat rate
- 2 charge throughout the Commonwealth. No geographical divisions
- 3 shall be used in the determination of motor vehicle insurance rates.
