## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-Five.

### AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE TRANSPORTATION OF HANDICAPPED PERSONS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 22 of chapter 40 of the General Laws is hereby amended  
2 by striking out the second paragraph, as most recently amended by  
3 section 1 of chapter 417 of the acts of 1957, and inserting in place  
4 thereof the following paragraph: —

5 No penalty shall be imposed upon any disabled veteran or handi-  
6 capped person, whose vehicle bears the distinctive number plates  
7 authorized by section two of chapter ninety, for parking such  
8 vehicle on any way for a longer period of time than permitted by  
9 said ordinance, by-laws, rules or orders; provided, however, that no  
10 penalty shall be imposed upon any person for the parking of a  
11 motor vehicle on any way for a longer period of time than permitted  
12 by said ordinance, by laws, rules or orders of a city or town,  
13 notwithstanding the fact that such vehicle does not bear the distinc-  
14 tive number plates authorized by section two of chapter ninety,  
15 which such vehicle is parked at that particular location for the sole  
16 purpose of picking up and transporting to another location a  
17 handicapped person.
