By Mr. Grenier of Spencer, petition of Henry R. Grenier relative to the licensing of barbers and hairdressers. Government Regulations.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-Five.

AN ACT TO COMBINE THE BOARDS OF REGISTRATION OF BARBERS AND HAIRDRESSERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any special law, one Board of
2 Registration is to be formed to regulate barbers and hairdressers to
3 be composed of qualified personnel in both areas.

1 SECTION 2. Barber shops or beauty salons should be allowed
2 to advertise the word "Barber" or the word "Hairdresser" or both
3 services as long as the personnel are properly licensed in their
4 respective fields. In addition if a person is licensed as a barber and
5 as a hairdresser he would be allowed to perform both services in
6 the same shop.

1 SECTION 3. Anyone performing both services should obtain
2 a license as a barber and also as a hairdresser in the same manner as
3 prescribed in the existing law.
