AN ACT PROHIBITING THE USE OF COIN OPERATED MACHINES BY THE STATE LOTTERY COMMISSION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 The state lottery commission is hereby directed that it is not to
- 2 use any devices that will accept a coin and pay off a winner or any
- 3 similar machines in the operation of the state lottery.

Section 1. (a) There is hereby established a Commission on the Status of Women, to be known as the Commission on the Status of Women, consisting of the following members:
