AN ACT DIRECTING THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ENGINEERING TO PROVIDE IMMEDIATE RELIEF FOR WEED CONTROL AND CLEANUP AT QUABOAG POND AND QUACUMQUASIT LAKE.

1 *Whereas*, The deferred operation of this act would tend to
2 defeat its purposes, which is to provide Quaboag Pond and Qua-
3 cumquasit Lake with immediate assistance for cleanup and weed
4 control at these bodies of water, therefore it is hereby declared to be
5 an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the
6 public convenience.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary,
2 the Department of Environmental Quality Engineering is here-
3 by authorized and directed to immediately undertake those
4 measures that it deems necessary and appropriate for the
5 restoration of Quaboag Pond and Quacumquasit Lake, located
6 in the towns of Brookfield, East Brookfield, and Sturbridge.
