**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Ninety-One.

AN ACT ESTABLISHING AN INTERAGENCY COORDINATING COUNCIL TO ADDRESS ISSUES OF INTERAGENCY RESPONSIBILITY FOR PUBLIC HEALTH AND CONSUMER PROTECTION CONCERNING INDOOR AIR POLLUTION AND OTHER THREATS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 That there be established an Interagency Coordinating Council.  
2 The Council will address issues of interagency responsibility for  
3 public health and consumer protection concerning indoor air  
4 pollution and other threats. The Council shall be charged with  
5 defining appropriate Massachusetts actions for prevention and  
6 remediation of such threats.

7 Such Council shall meet on a regular basis, at least twice a year.  
8 Because of the inter-relationship of outdoor and indoor pollution  
9 and to protect public health and ensure safe working conditions,  
10 and prevent fraud, the Council shall include Commissioners of  
11 the Department of Public Health, which shall be the Chair of the  
12 Council, the Department of Environmental Quality Engineering,  
13 the Department of Labor and Industries, the Building Code  
14 Commission, and the Secretaries of the Office of Consumer  
15 Affairs and the Executive Office of Energy Resources.

16 The Council's purpose shall include, but not be limited to the  
17 following:

- 18 a) to establish interagency work groups on specific issues;

- 19 b) to designate lead agencies for implementing necessary  
20 programs, including distribution of public information;
- 21 c) to discuss, and set procedures for developing appropriate  
22 monitoring methods and reporting;
- 23 d) establish procedures for defining health risks as they relate  
24 to indoor air contaminants and the protection of public health  
25 in the Commonwealth;
- 26 e) to coordinate and prepare recommendations on other actions  
27 and activities related to indoor air pollution to ensure effective  
28 use and sharing to state resources in protecting public health and  
29 welfare.
