## AN ACT RELATIVE TO HOME INSPECTORS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- Chapter 112 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding
- at the end the following new sections, sections 148A 3
- through 148I: -
- Section 148A. Definitions. For the purpose of Sec-4
- tions 148A-148I the following words and phrases unless the
- context otherwise requires, shall have the following meanings: 7 "Board" — the board of registration of home inspectors.
- 8 "Dwelling" - any single family or multiple family building
- that has as its principal purpose the "home inspector". Any person
- who for another person and for a fee or other valuable 10
- consideration or with the intention or in the expectation of upon 11
- the promise of receiving or collecting a fee or other valuable 12
- consideration engages in the business of inspecting a person's 13
- dwelling and making recommendations including but not limited
- to the dwelling's structural, electrical, plumbing, heating, cooling,
- insulating, ventilating systems. And whose recommendations are
- relied upon by the potential purchaser of the dwelling. 17
- 18 Section 148B. Rules and regulations; records; reports. The
- board may make and publish necessary rules and regulations for 19 20
- the proper conduct of its duties, and keep a full record of its
- 21 proceedings and keep a record of names of all persons examined 22
- or registered by it, which shall be open to public inspection. The board shall make an annual report containing a full and complete
- account of all its official acts during the preceeding year. 24

25 Section 148C. Application for certificate; filing; fees: qualifications of applicant. Every person, before engaging in the 26 practice of home inspection in this commonwealth, shall make 27 application to the board, on a form prescribed and furnished by 28 it, for a certificate to practice home inspection. Said application 29 shall be filed with the secretary of the board at least thirty days 30 before the date of examination, and shall be accompanied by an 31 examination fee as determined annually by the commissioner of 32 administration under the provision of section three B of chap-33 ter seven or, in the case of reexamination, each applicant shall 34 pay a fee as determined under the aforementioned provision for 35 36 each subject upon which he is of good moral character, and shall furnish the board with satisfactory proof that he has at least two 37 years experience as a plumber, electrician, architect, structural or 38 electrical engineer and that he is a graduate of a trade school or 39 college approved by the board. 40 41

Section 148D. Refusal to grant certificate; revocation. The board may refuse to grant a certificate to any person who has been convicted of a felony involving moral turpitude, who has been guilty of unprofessional conduct, and may, for any of said causes, after due notice and hearing, revoke a certificate already issued.

Section 148E. Certificate of registration; necessity; display. No person shall represent himself to be a home inspector or use the title home inspector in the commonwealth on any sign, title, card or other device to indicate that such person is a home inspector unless such person shall have secured from the board a certificate of registration as a home inspector. Every holder of a certificate of such registrtion shall display it in a conspicuous place in his principal office or place of employment within the commonwealth

Section 148F. Examinations; rules and regulations. Examinations for registration as a home inspector shall be held by the 56 board at least once each year, provided that applications shall have been received during the time announced. The board shall adopt rules and regulations covering the subjects and scope of the examinations, shall publish appropriate announcements and shall conduct the examinations at the times designated. Except as hereinafter provided, every applicant for registration as a home inspector shall be required, in addition to all other requirements,

64 to establish, by written examination his competency to inspect and give advice as to structural, electrical, plumbing, heating and cooling systems of a dwelling. Each written examination may be 66 supplemented by such oral examinations as the board shall 67

determine. 68

Section 148G. Fees. Fees for home inspectors shall be 69 determined annually by the commissioner of administration under 70 the provision of section three B of chapter seven and shall be paid 71 72 to the board for the following: -

(a) Annual registration fee on or before the thirty-first day of 73 January of each year, if not so paid, a penalty shall be added to 74

the amount thereof. 75

- 76 (b) Failure to renew certificate of registration within sixty days after notification by the board that his certificate has expired, 77 shall, before again using the title of home inspector within the 78 79 commonwealth, be required to reregister, and may be required by the board to be reexamined. 80
  - (c) Application fee for examination.

(d) An original certificate.

(e) A duplicate certificate.

Section 148H. Suspension or revocation of certificate; 84 reissuance. The board after due notice and hearing, may suspend 85 or revoke the certificate of registration of a home inspector upon 86 87 proof satisfactory to the board:

(a) that the holder of such certificate of registration is in violation of any provision of sections 148A to 148I, inclusive, or of any rule or regulation promulgated by the board;

(b) that such certificate of registration was obtained by fraud 91 92 or misrepresentation;

93 (c) that any money or thing of value, except fees prescribed or authorized by said sections, was paid or received to secure the 94 issuance of such certificate of registration; 95 96

(d) that the holder of such certificate of registration has been

97 guilty of a felony;

98 (e) that the holder of such certificate of registration has been 99 guilty of fraud or deceit, or of gross negligence, incompetency or 100 misconduct, in the use of the title of home inspector.

101 The board may reissue a certificate of registration to any person 102 whose certificate of registration has been revoked. Application for

- 103 the reissuance of a certificate of registration shall be made in such 104 manner as the board may direct.
- Section 148I. Unlawful conduct; penalties. It shall be unlawful for any person to:
- (a) hold himself as a home inspector unless he is registeredunder the provisions of sections 148A to 148H, inclusive;
- 109 (b) present as his own the certificate of registration of another;
- (c) give false or forged evidence to the board of registration or any member thereof in obtaining a certificate;
- (d) falsely impersonate any other registrant of like or different name;
- (e) use or attempt to use a certificate or registration that has been revoked; or
- (f) otherwise violate any of the provisions of said sections.
- Each such violation shall be punished by a fine of not less than
- 118 one hundred dollars nor more than five hundred dollars, or by
- 119 imprisonment for not more than one year, or both.
