AN ACT MANDATING LAP-SHOULDER BELTS FOR SCHOOL BUSES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 7C of chapter 90 of the General Laws shall be amended
- 2 by adding the following paragraphs: —
- 3 (1) Notwithstanding any law or regulation to the contrary, the
- 4 following standards shall be applicable to all school buses
- 5 manufactured after August 15, 1992.
- 6 (a) Each such school bus shall be constructed so as to provide
- 7 each passenger with a minimum passenger seating width of 15
- 8 inches.
- 9 (b) Each seat in such bus shall be equipped with a lap-shoulder
- 10 belt, with a refractor, for each passenger, which shall be worn
- 11 whenever vehicle is in motion.
- 12 (c) Each seat back in such bus shall be 28 inches in height and
- 13 shall meet U.S.D.O.T. MVSS standards.
