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## **The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

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AN ACT TO ESTABLISH A COMPREHENSIVE TRAFFIC SAFETY EDUCATION PROGRAM.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 The fourth sentence of section 1A of Chapter 69 of the General
- 2 Laws is replaced by the following: —
- 3 Said director shall include within such curriculum the
- 4 development of a traffic safety education program for use in all
- 5 public elementary and high schools in the Commonwealth: said
- 6 program shall include pedestrian, bicycle and vehicle occupant
- 7 safety components; said director shall work in conjunction with
- 8 the Massachusetts Bicycle Advisory Board and Bicycle Program
- 9 Manager to develop, implement, and review such a program.
